

**NORTH CAROLINA LOCKSMITH LICENSING BOARD
THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 8, 2005
GREENSBORO, NORTH CAROLINA**

Attendance: Tom Campion, Chair, Laura Busse, Ron Cox, Neal Ensley, Greg Wright, Anna Bridgers.

Guest in Attendance: Steve Bright.

The Board meeting was called to order by Tom Campion. Tom welcomed everyone to the meeting. Neal read the Ethics Awareness and Conflict of Interest statement. No one indicated that they have any conflicts.

The first order of business was approval of the August 8, 2005 meeting minutes. Ron made a motion to approve the minutes as prepared by Anna. Greg seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Laura deferred the Treasurer's report until the next Board meeting as the financial statement for August has not yet been prepared.

The next order of business was document creation. Laura stated that she has drafted a notice that can be included in the mailing with the new licensure badge to each licensee. This notice instructs licensees how to make a formal complaint to the Board about an individual providing locksmith services without possessing a locksmith license. Laura stated that the Board might also want to enclose a letter with information about pre-approved sponsors of continuing education to assist locksmiths in locating educational opportunities. Laura also instructed Anna that a letter should accompany the badges to inform the licensee that his license has been renewed for another three year period.

Anna told the Board members that new postcards have been printed which will be mailed to locksmiths who have failed to submit their license renewal paperwork at least 90 days prior to their expiration date. This notice allows locksmiths to mail in their applications to renew their licenses within a ten day period without having to pay any late fees.

Laura made a motion to accept the letter that she drafted informing licensees how to make official complaints to the Board. Greg seconded this motion and the motion passed unanimously.

Tom and Ron, members of the Public Relations Committee, had nothing new to report.

The next report came from the Examination Committee. Laura gave a report in regards to the passing rate of those who took the August examination. Ten of the 12 examiners passed the test.

Steve Bright then stated that a number of those who had volunteered to assist with the creation of the new locksmith examinations can no longer participate in this effort. Laura stated that a new committee will need to be created for this purpose.

Laura said that she would like to have a survey provided with each locksmith examination that would reveal how each locksmith prepared for the exam. Laura stated that this would help the Board with determining what factors contribute to one being able to successfully complete and pass the exam.

Laura said that there was nothing new to report in regards to the Rules Committee.

There was also no Miscellaneous Business to report.

Anna stated that the Board does have some unfinished business that needs to be tended to, but this will have to occur at the next Board meeting since several Ethics Committee members are absent.

Neal asked the Board about the conclusion of the discussion regarding individuals advertising in the yellow pages under the locksmith heading without a license number. Laura said that the directory companies are not liable for allowing this to happen, but the Board can continue to police locksmiths who advertise without having a license.

The Board then recessed.

Upon returning from the break, Tom suggested that the Board send a letter to Senator Tony Rand. Neal made a motion for the Board to write Senator Tony Rand a letter of appreciation for his efforts in protecting the Board's interest this year in the legislature. Ron seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Laura then read the names of those locksmiths that are approved for licensure. Laura also stated that the first batch of license renewals is ready for a vote. Greg made a motion to license the list of locksmiths and grant approval for the 73 locksmiths renewing their licenses. Neal seconded the motion and the motion carried.

There was no new business to report.

Laura made a motion for the next Board meeting to be held on Wednesday, October 26th in Greensboro. Greg seconded the motion. The motion passed.

With no further business to discuss, Greg made a motion to adjourn. Ron seconded the motion, and the meeting was adjourned.
